**NAPOLEONVILLE MALE PLEAS TO TWO (2) COUNTS OF DISTRIBUTION OF CRACK COCAINE**

Jacoby Butler, a 26 year old male of Napoleonville, LA pled guilty to two (2) counts of Distribution of a Schedule II Controlled Dangerous Substance on October 17, 2011. The Honorable Judge Thomas J. Kliebert sentenced Butler to twenty (20) years in the Department of Corrections. Butler's arrest was a result of the Assumption Parish Sheriff's Office Drug Operation "Get a Real Job." The case was prosecuted by Thomas D. Daigle, Assistant District Attorney.

**NAPOLEONVILLE MALE PLEAS TO THREE (3) COUNTS OF DISTRIBUTION OF CRACK COCAINE**

Floyd Truehill, Jr. a 33 year old male of Napoleonville, LA pled guilty to three (3) counts of Distribution of a Schedule II Controlled Dangerous Substance on October 18, 2011. The Honorable Judge Thomas J. Kliebert sentenced Truehill to twenty (20) years in the Department of Corrections. Truehill's arrest was a result of the Assumption Parish Sheriff's Office Drug Operation "Get a Real Job." The case was prosecuted by Thomas D. Daigle, Assistant District Attorney.

**NAPOLEONVILLE MALE SENTENCED ON TWO (2) COUNTS OF DISTRIBUTION OF A CRACK COCAINE**

On July 19, 2011, Kentrell Jupiter, 21, of Napoleonville, LA pled guilty to two (2) counts of Distribution of a Schedule II Controlled Dangerous Substance. After conducting a Pre Sentence Investigation, Jupiter was sentenced on October 17, 2011 by the Honorable Judge Thomas J. Kliebert Jr. to (5) five years in the Department of Corrections with the first two (2) years of the sentence being without benefit of probation and parole. Jupiter's arrest was a result of the Assumption Parish Sheriff's Office Drug

Operation "Get a Real Job." The case was prosecuted by Thomas D. Daigle, Assistant District Attorney.

**NAPOLEONVILLE FEMALE SENTENCED ON THE CHARGE OF DISTRIBUTION OF CRACK COCAINE**

On July 19, 2011, Beatrice Thompson, 52, of Napoleonville, LA pled guilty to the charge of Distribution of a Schedule II Controlled Dangerous Substance. After conducting a Pre Sentence Investigation, Thompson was sentenced on October 17, 2011 by the Honorable Judge Thomas J. Kliebert Jr. to (3) three years in the Department of Corrections with the first two (2) years being without benefit of probation and parole. Thompson's arrest was a result of the Assumption Parish Sheriff's Office Drug Operation "Get a Real Job." The case was prosecuted by Thomas D. Daigle, Assistant District Attorney.

**PIERRE PART FEMALE PLEAS TO DISTRIBUTION OF HYDROCODONE**

Laura Cook, a 20 year old female of Pierre Part, LA pled guilty to the charge of Distribution of a Schedule III Controlled Dangerous Substance on October 17, 2011. The Honorable Judge Thomas J. Kliebert will sentence Cook on December 19, 2011 to five (5) years in the Department of Corrections which sentence will be suspended, and Cook will be placed on supervised probation for (5) years. Cook's arrest was a result of the Assumption Parish Sheriff's Office Drug Operation "Get a Real Job." The case was prosecuted by Thomas D. Daigle, Assistant District Attorney.

**THIBODAUX MALE PLEAS TO THEFT OVER \$1500**

Terrell Exnicious, a 23 year old male of Thibodaux, LA pled guilty to the charge of Theft valued over \$1500 on October 17, 2011. The Honorable Judge Thomas J. Kliebert will sentence Exnicious on December 19, 2011 to five (5) years in the Department of Corrections which sentenced will be suspended, and Exnicious will be placed on five (5) years supervised probation. Exnicious will be ordered to pay \$6,000.00 in restitution.

**PAINCOURTVILLE MALE PLEAS TO DISTRIBUTION OF MARIJUANA**

Danzel McBride, a 18 year old male of Paincourtville, LA pled guilty to the charge of Distribution of a Schedule I Controlled Dangerous Substance on October 17, 2011. The Honorable Judge Thomas J. Kliebert will sentence McBride on December 19, 2011 to five (5) years in the Department of Corrections which sentenced will be suspended, and McBride will be placed on five (5) years supervised probation. McBride's arrest was a result of the Assumption Parish Sheriff's Office Drug Operation "Get a Real Job." The case was prosecuted by Thomas D. Daigle, Assistant District Attorney.
